Dave Price is best known as the weather anchor for CBS's *The Early Show*, a position he held for eight years, along with covering major weather events for the CBS *Evening News*. In addition to meteorology and reporting on-site from natural disasters, Price has traveled throughout the country and around the globe bringing amazing stories to millions of viewers.

Price has covered an incredible array of stories for someone who didn't enter the broadcasting industry until he was almost 30 years of age. Armed with a bachelor's degree in industrial and labor relations from Cornell University and a master's degree in organizational psychology from Columbia University, he spent almost a decade as a human resources executive with Pepsi-Cola, Texaco and Taco Bell. His job was to advise those companies on best practice solutions.

In the fall of 1995, he aggressively lost 80 pounds and turned his life around. The following year Price quit his job as a human resources executive in pursuit of his passion. His transition took him from the office chair to the anchor chair. He began as a part of FOX's *Good Day Philadelphia* before moving to New York and FOX's flagship station to do weather and co-host WNYW-TV's *Good Day New York*. He later joined WCBS-TV and CBS News. He's won five Emmy awards and a Gracie award for his work in this industry.

Price had a first-person view of some of the most momentous events of our time as he was in New York City, on-air, as the first tragic moments of September 11 unfolded. He was one of the few reporters who spent the night enduring Hurricane Katrina inside the Superdome in New Orleans with the city's residents. He also covered the earthquake in Haiti in 2010 and the oil spill in the Gulf of Mexico for the network. He's been on the frontlines of the war on terror in Afghanistan and has been to Iraq six times, including the night Saddam Hussein was executed.

Other occasions he has been at the center of include inaugurations, Super Bowls, NBA Championships, World Series, Final Fours, U.S. Opens, Olympics, and ticker-tape parades. In addition, he's flown with the Blue Angels over the Florida coastline, canoed down the Amazon in Ecuador, and rode a Harley Davidson in the Australian Outback. His stops have taken him to every state in the nation and to over 80 countries.

When Price is not reporting, he is involved in numerous local and national charity organizations. He is a certified scuba diver, a licensed pilot, and an avid photographer. In 2009, Sacred Heart University bestowed an honorary Doctor of Humane Letters degree on him. He and his wife Jacqueline live in Connecticut along with their dog Wally.
